

# Hazardous Weather Briefing


National Weather Service Little Rock, Arkansas

> March 7, 2024 6:00 AM CST

- A storm system arriving from the southern Plains will bring widespread showers and thunderstorms to Arkansas today through Friday night.
- Isolated severe storms could occur over western Arkansas today. Large hail would be the main concern.
- Isolated to scattered severe storms could occur across mainly the southern half of Arkansas on Friday. The main concern will be large hail and damaging winds, however a tornado or two can not be ruled out. The environment will be most unstable (warm/moist) toward the Gulf Coast, and that is where damaging winds/a few tornadoes are most favored.
- The forecast calls for one to two inches of rain across much of the state, with locally heavier amounts possible in the north. Any flash flooding should be localized.
- Sub-freezing temperatures possible Sunday morning over portions of Arkansas.

### **Severe Weather Outlook (March 7, 2024)**






Isolated to scattered severe storms are possible across western Arkansas today.

The main concern today will be large hail.



### **Severe Weather Outlook (March 8, 2024)**





Isolated to scattered severe storms are possible across a large part of Arkansas on Friday.

The greatest concern will be over roughly the southern half of Arkansas.

The main concern will be large hail and damaging winds, however a tornado or two can not be ruled out.





























Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms will be noted on Thursday and Friday. The forecast calls for one to two inches of rain across much of Arkansas, with locally heavier amounts possible.

Any flash flooding should be localized.

Areas highlighted in green represent locations expected to be above 32F.

Frost will be possible for locations between 33F and 36F.
