

Severe Weather Possible Thursday and Thursday Night

- A storm system arriving from the Plains will bring showers and thunderstorms to Arkansas Thursday and Thursday night.
- Isolated to scattered severe thunderstorms could occur across the western two-thirds of Arkansas Thursday and Thursday night. The main concern will be large hail and damaging winds, however a tornado can not be ruled out. The environment will be most unstable (warm/moist) in the southwest part of the state, and that is where damaging winds, large hail, and a few tornadoes are most favorable.
- The forecast calls for 1.5 to 3 inches of rain across a large portion of the state Thursday and Thursday night. There will be a chance of flash flooding.





Isolated to scattered severe thunderstorms are possible across a large portion of Arkansas Thursday afternoon and evening.

The greatest concern will be over roughly the western two-thirds of Arkansas.


The main concern will be large hail and damaging winds, however a tornado cannot be ruled out.


















Scattered to numerous showers and thunderstorms are expected Thursday and Thursday night.

The forecast calls for a large area of 1.5 to 3 inch rainfall amounts across Arkansas.

Flash flooding will be possible.
