

# Severe Weather Briefing 

National Weather Service
Little Rock, Arkansas

Jan I7, 2023 6:00 AM

- Rain and thunderstorms will be likely throughout the day on Wednesday and into Wednesday night across Arkansas, especially across southeastern Arkansas.
- A few strong to severe storms will be possible with damaging winds, hail, and a few brief tornadoes.
- Additionally, up to 1.5 and 2 inches or more of rain is expected over east and southeast Arkansas on Wednesday.
- Much of this area has seen significant amounts of rain within the last couple of weeks, and isolated flash flooding will be possible Wednesday afternoon and evening.
- Expect an increase in water levels on area rivers and streams.

Portions of southern, southeastern, and eastern Arkansas are under a Slight Risk for Excessive Rainfall on Wednesday.

Much of this area has seen significant amounts of rain within the last couple of weeks, and isolated flash flooding will be possible Wednesday afternoon and evening.


Rainfall totals from Wednesday through Wednesday night will be greatest in the southern and eastern part of the state.

Rainfall totals could reach values between 1.5 and 2+ inches over a large portion of the state. A few locations could see rainfall totals approach 3 inches.
